*In order to protect the kitchen equipment, visiting cooks and your participants, the Grand Columbia Council requires the presence of an approved supervisor (normally an employee of the council). All personnel in the kitchen are responsible to this supervisor in the operation of the equipment, food handling and sanitation. Washington State requires that all food workers(work with unpackaged food, food equipment or utensils or with any surface where people put unwrapped food) have food safety training before handling food served to the public. Food workers who take a food safety training class and pass the State of Washington exam on food safety basics are issued a Food Worker Card (also called a Food Handler Permit).

50% of Fees are due at the time of reservation. Refunds will only be made when 14 days advance written notice is given prior to your reservation. Units will be charged for damage to facilities.

Scout Unit Short Term Camp Reservation**Rules of the Camp**

- 1) All units must check in with the camp ranger/caretaker before proceeding to campsite/building.
- 2) All units must check out with the camp ranger/caretaker before leaving.
- 3) Buildings used must be cleaned prior to leaving. A Scout always leaves an area better than he found it.
- 4) All vehicles are to remain in designated parking areas.
- 5) No timber is to be cut.
- 6) Units responsible for damaging property will be charged for the cost of replacement or repair.
- 7) Electric or propane heaters are for maintenance purposes only (Camp Fife only). Heating should be done with firewood, please do not transport firewood to Camp Fife. There is ample firewood available. Free in years we have a surplus, a very reasonable fee in other years. Do not adjust the temperature on the camp heaters.
- 8) Care should be taken in cleaning up the dining facility if used. Ovens, ranges, freezers, sinks and the dining hall will be checked for cleanliness. Cost for cleaning by the Caretaker will be assessed at \$20.00 per hour.
- 9) No equipment or furnishings are to be moved without the prior permission of the Scout Executive or his designee.
- 10) All garbage is to be removed from camp. (Camp Fife has a dumpster available.)
- 11) All open fires must be placed only in existing fire rings. Fires must be completely extinguished before leaving camp.
- 12) No weapons of any type are allowed without prior permission of the Scout Executive. The following will not be authorized: paint ball, air soft, etc.
- 13) No illegal substances or intoxicating liquors are allowed on council property.
- 14) Scouts are to stay off of roofs of camp buildings. No exceptions.
- 15) No pets are allowed in camp except for service dogs for medical needs.
- 16) Scouting units are expected to follow all rules and policies of the Boy Scouts of America.

Failure to adhere to the rules of camp may result in being asked to leave camp and forfeiture
